# **Maths Mastery Programme**

After working successfully alongside the Cheshire and Wirral Maths Hub over the last two years, we now move into the 'Embedding Year' of the maths mastery programme. Having changed our lesson structure to focus on reasoning and problem solving, this year aims to deliver this consistently across the school. Children are exposed to high level questions, where they explore maths and make links between their fluency skills and their ability to answer word problems. This allows them to spend more time on thinking about why and how they have arrived at an answer. Children will be asked to draw, show, explain and prove how they have worked out a question to show they have a 'mastery' of topics throughout the maths curriculum. Moving throughout the year, children's understanding of core concepts will benefit from this process and they will be able to draw links to maths in everyday scenarios.
