What is the Sports Premium?

The Government provided funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013/14 and 2014/15 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding'. This funding was jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and saw money going directly to primary school headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. This funding has since been extended to 2020.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of funding

Schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but have the freedom to choose how they do this. However, the use of this funding is monitored closely by Ofsted.

Suggested uses for the funding include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- new or additional Change4Life sport clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs.
