# Timing changes for the New Year

Feedback from all stakeholders means from January we are narrowing beginning of the day drop off times and lengthening the end of the day.

Please be on time and ensure your child has all their processions with them so staff are not coming back to the gate in the morning.

# From Tuesday January 4th;

#### Drop Off

8.45a.m. to 8.55a.m. – Please continue to use the same gates and ensure you do not loiter at drop off. Temperature checks will continue as they do now.

Yr. 6 start time will remain at 8.30a.m.

Breakfast club will remain at 8.35a.m. <u>Collection:</u> All pupils will come out <u>at 3.15p.m.</u> Infants need collecting off the yard as now between <u>3.15p.m. and 3.20p.m. no later.</u> <u>All other classes will also follow these timings at the end of the day and from the exact same gates as we do</u> <u>now.</u>

#### Safeguarding Team

This term we have put together a school safeguarding team. This consists of 10 children in Years 5 and 6 and we meet monthly to ensure school feels safe for the children. Our first task was to design our pupil survey and get that completed so that we could capture the children's thoughts from across the school. The children leading on this have been outstanding and very helpful.

Today the Year 6 safeguarding group went out to deliver Christmas cards to the residents of Clarendon Care Home. This has been part of the Nantwich Educational Partnership (NEP)'s 'Hearts to Homes' Christmas initiative. This year 18 schools took part, each making cards which were then shared out amongst all the schools and a selection then distributed back to each of the 18 schools to take out to a designated care home in their area. This sent a strong message of support and best wishes from the young people of our town to our older citizens. We are very proud to take part in this initiative and as one wise young man commented after our visit to Clarendon 'That felt good'. It did indeed and I was an extremely proud Headteacher to see such fine young people displaying kindness and respect to the community.
