An unwelcome visitor returns

Unfortunately, the last two weeks has seen a very clear return of COVID infections. This is being experienced by staff, parents, community members and children.

Realistically very few are now testing so we never know exactly what infections are in the building but, we would ask for everyone's safety that if your child is unwell particularly with a high temperature that you keep them at home until they are well enough to return. We have faced challenges with staffing again and we want to ensure everything we want to deliver for the children can happen so please work with us.

The current local authority guidance stands as:

'Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days.'

Next Academic Year

We are already busy planning the year ahead and move-up morning took place today. It is difficult for staff to say goodbye to their classes and challenging for our children too. We are ensuring that additional activities are happening such as extra time with new teachers, visits to the next classroom, drop-ins from support staff etc. All so that we can make that move as seamless as possible.

In addition, we are planning a variety of parent workshops and drop-in opportunities for the autumn term including Internet safety, phonics and maths. If you have any suggestions do let us know at the gate. This is your school and we want to ensure you feel as supported as we can.

Phonics update

From September we will be introducing our new 'Little Wandle Phonics' scheme. This is a complete phonics package not hugely different from the one we use now but reflects new guidance and is informed by the latest research into raising reading achievement in children particularly in Reception and Year 1. Mrs Newman is taking on the role as Early Reading Lead and Mrs Lacy continues to offer excellent leadership of literacy across the school.

Huge thanks to Mrs Haydn-Lee and Mrs Hillman for the hours and hours they have already put in to prepare resources ready for staff to use in September. Changes of contact details, medical alerts and asthma inhalers

It is vital that you ensure we have your up-to-date contact details. Being able to contact parents in an emergency is vital to keep your child safe so please let us know any changes of phones numbers of yourself and your additional emergency contacts and if you move house. If you check the attendance record that came home in your child's report you can see the data, we currently hold for your child and see if it is accurate.

In addition, we need to know any allergies or medication changes that may affect your child when in school. Asthma inhalers and epi-pens must be replaced regularly to stay in date. Out of date medication will be sent home.

Income related free school meals (IRFSM)

If your child is in receipt of income related free school meals, they are automatically eligible for the Household Support Fund.

You can claim free school meals for each child who attends school in Cheshire East if you receive one of these benefits:

- Universal Credit with no earned income or with net monthly earnings less than £616.67
- Income Support
- Income based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit as long as you have a yearly household income of less than £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs) and do not get Working Tax Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

We suggest you do make a claim for free school meals even if your child is in key stage 1. This gives your child access to additional financial support in school such as a cost reduction on trips and residential.

You can apply for nursery-age children if they attend before and after lunch sessions at a local authority nursery school, nursery class or an Academy nursery if it has the same Ofsted number as the primary school.
