### **Insects**

Just a reminder that when the weather gets drier it increases the number of biting critters that seem to live in the forest area and in the surrounding grass. A number of our children appear to be tasty treats for these insects so if your child is one of these then please send them in long sleeve tops and long trousers. Last year, I bought some citronella infused bracelets which helped but you may also want to invest in some insect repellant for your child too. Unfortunately, the insects seem to live under the bark in the forest area and become prolific during dry spells and then once it rains the larvae and insects are then dispersed and it becomes less of a problem. We did try and minimize the time spent in the forest area during forest school sessions last year but if we plan in advance hopefully we can minimize the impact and the discomfort that the insects cause.

# Holidays in term time

This is a polite reminder that holidays during term time will not be authorized unless there are exceptional circumstances. See the attendance policy below:

Parent(s)/carer(s) do not have the right to take their child or young person out of school for a holiday. In exceptional circumstances, the school may grant leave of absence up to 10 days and it may be necessary for a longer planned absence. All such cases must be discussed with the Head Teacher, as a child or young person who is absent longer than 10 days after an agreed return date, can legally be removed from the school roll and the parents/carers may be liable to prosecution.

In considering whether or not to authorise leave for a family holiday/leave of absence, the school will consider each case individually, taking into account a child or young person's overall attendance and the reason for the absence. The school will not authorise holidays taken during any examination weeks.

A 'LEAVE OF ABSENCE REQUEST FORM' (see Appendix 4) is available from the school office and on the school website. It must be completed in advance of the absence and returned to the school where it will need to be discussed with the Head Teacher. This discussion will contribute towards the final decision.

- It must clearly state on the form why it is necessary that this absence has to be taken in term time.
- Lower cost holiday is not a reason.
- On receipt of the 'Leave of Absence Request Form', parents/carers will be sent a response indicating whether the school is able to authorise your request or not.

Reasons for not authorising it might include:-

- Unsatisfactory attendance
- Time of year, e.g. if pupils are sitting assessments
- If leave of absence has already been authorised during the current academic year
- It is a holiday request in school term time
- There does not appear to be an exceptional circumstance surrounding the request

If parents, contrary to what the school has said, still decide to take their child out of school, then the absence will be coded as 'unauthorised.' This may lead to the school referring the matter to the Local Authority requesting a Fixed Penalty Notice to be issued.

From August 2024, the fine for school absences across the country will be £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid within 28 days.

This rate is in line with inflation and is the first increase since 2012.
